ON-SITE MENTORING PROGRAM GROWS IN SELINSGROVE Grant Story

Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS) of NEPA is growing their on-site SMART program in Selinsgrove schools through a 2022 grant from Community Giving Foundation: Selinsgrove. The program matches area students with a Susquehanna University volunteer mentor who offers friendship and advice through one-on-one mentoring opportunities. After-school sessions with mentors provide students with homework and classwork help, encouraging them to improve their academic performance. BBBS also organizes group games and activities for all students and mentors, demonstrating positive social behaviors and opportunities for social interaction with peers.

Without grant funding from the Foundation, BBBS would have less flexibility in the number of children served and mentors involved. Grants also supplement costs for the games, crafts, and other group activities offered to students during the program.

"BBBS would like to thank the Foundation for their support of this new on-site SMART program at Selinsgrove schools. With this funding, our support staff and Susquehanna University students will be able to provide one-on-one mentorship, activities, and supplies for area youth."

HELP LINE CONNECTS CALLERS WITH VITAL RESOURCES Grant Story

Through a Selinsgrove grant last year, PA 211 NE/Help Line callers from Snyder County were able to speak with trained caseworkers to address their needs 24 hours per day. Caseworkers connected callers with resources and referrals to address vital needs including food insecurity, rent assistance, shelter, utility assistance, and physical and mental health treatments. National statistics estimate that 70% of Help Line callers fall below the poverty level, representing some of the most vulnerable and underserved communities within Snyder County and Pennsylvania. This resource continues to make a difference.

PASSIONATE VISION CONTINUES TO PROMOTE TOGETHERNESS Donor Story

Over 25 years ago, a dedicated and passionate group of volunteer leaders, residents, and business owners worked together to create the Selinsgrove Commons, a beautiful park in downtown Selinsgrove that serves as the heart of the town. Overseen by Selinsgrove Projects, Inc. and a dedicated Commons Committee, an agency endowment fund was created in 2015 to care for the beautification and management of the park in perpetuity. As a result of the many generous donors that have contributed to the fund since its creation, the Commons continues to serve as a gathering place for the community.



Throughout the summer, people assemble for the Rudy Gelnett Summer Concert series, while Saturdays are host to the local farmer's market. Other annual events include the Selinsgrove Street Fair and White Christmas activities during the holiday season. Whether you head to the Commons for an organized event or an impromptu picnic in the park, the impact of the space is clear—the time and persistence poured into the Commons continues to promote a spirit of togetherness.
