## COMBATING CHILDHOOD HUNGER IN SUNBURY

### Grant Story

In partnership with a 2021 grant from the Community Giving Foundation: Sunbury, the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank provided more than 105,000 healthy meals to 1,470 children in the Sunbury region through afterschool programs, weekend backpacks, and groceries from school pantries. Children are most vulnerable to experiencing food insecurity while they are unable to access school breakfast and lunch programs. Central Pennsylvania Food Bank seeks to fill the gap and help offset the negative impacts of sustained youth food insecurity.
