GROWING COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS COMMUNITY GIVING FOUNDATION: BLOOMSBURG

In 1996, the Town of Bloomsburg invested the interest paid back on a loan borrowed by Magee Industrial Enterprises from a Federal Urban Development Grant (UDAG), creating the Bloomsburg Area Community Foundation. Through the advocacy of local community members, the Foundation was established to support a variety of area organizations serving residents of the Bloomsburg community.

The Foundation affiliated with the Central Susquehanna Community Foundation (now Community Giving Foundation) in 2018 and awarded \$17,000 in local grants that same year. The partnership allowed Bloomsburg's board of directors to focus their efforts on raising funds and grantmaking decisions, while the Community Giving Foundation handled the administration, investment, and daily operational tasks. Through superior stewardship of enduring charitable gifts, Bloomsburg continues to exist to enhance lives, making the community a stronger and safer place for all.

Today, Community Giving Foundation: Bloomsburg remains committed to improving the quality of life in the greater Bloomsburg area, encouraging donors of all levels to achieve their charitable goals to benefit the community today and long into the future. In 2022, Bloomsburg's nine charitable funds granted nearly \$20,000 to local nonprofit organizations and awarded nearly \$4,000 in scholarships to area students. Community connections are growing meaningful impact in Bloomsburg—For Good. For Ever.
